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### Management Guideline for Suspected COVID-19 - For Medical Institutes

#### **Recommendations For COVID-19 Virus Detection**

1. Fever AND/OR 2. Acute respiratory symptoms such as Cough AND/OR 3. Recent Loss of Taste or Smell

## Category 1 Fever Screening

- 1.1 Person above 13
  years old who has
  FEVER but NO
  other diseases can
  be explained &
  NO any Category
  2 or 3 conditions;
- 1.2 Cross-boundary students under 13 years old who has FEVER but NO other diseases can be explained & NO any Category 2 or 3 conditions;
- 1.3 Other conditions according to clinical manifestations

# Category 2 <u>Test for SARS-CoV-2 But NO Need</u> Quarantine

One of the followings:

- 2.1 Having lived with, dinned together, worked with person above 13 years old who has fever or cough within 28 days before onset of illness;
- 2.2 Person who contact massive amount of tourists<sup>2</sup> or patients due to work nature;
- 2.3 Having close contact<sup>3</sup> with person from areas with low to moderate, moderate or high risk\* who has fever or respiratory symptoms within 28 days before onset of illness;
- 2.4 Person who live in Social Service Facilities (Residential Home) and develop the above symptoms;
- 2.5 Other conditions<sup>4</sup> assessed by clinical and/or epidemiological investigations

# Category 3 <u>Test for SARS-CoV-2 & Quarantine</u> for Observation until Ruled Out

One of the followings:

- 3.1 Having contact<sup>1,3</sup> with a COVID-19 case within **28** days before onset of illness;
- 3.2 Having stayed in areas with low to moderate, moderate or high risk\* within 28 days before onset of illness;
- 3.3 Having stayed in a building, institute or community with clusters within **28** days before onset of illness;
- 3.4 Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)<sup>5</sup> as one of the followings:
  - Any pneumonia of unexplained aetiology <sup>6</sup>;
  - Cluster <sup>7</sup>;
  - Health care workers (including port health inspection staff);
  - Unexplained severe, progressive or complicated respiratory illness not responding to treatment.

Once apply SARS-CoV-2 test, pls click according to <u>Category</u>:

- 1. Category 1: Fever Screening Health Code turn 'Yellow'
- 2. Category 2 or 3: Suspect case Health Code turn 'Red'

Treat according to clinical presentation, reassessment if necessary



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- General contact: having stayed in same classroom, workplace, household, same ward in hospital, or same region in residential institution, etc., but not met the definition of close contact.
- <sup>2.</sup> For example : casino dealer, hotel receptionist, restaurant waiter, taxi driver, tourist bus/bus driver or staff with similar work nature.
- 3. Close contact: having stayed within 1 metre in the same atmosphere, with no proper protection for >15 minutes.
- Assessment generally after contact tracing of a confirmed case.
- $^{5.}$  Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) :  $\mbox{\rm An}$ acute respiratory infection with:
  - history of fever or measured fever of ≥ 38 C° and cough;
  - onset within the last 10 days;
  - requiring hospitalization.

- <sup>6</sup> Pneumonia of unexplained aetiology: is defined as pneumonia patient who has the following four conditions and has not already explained by any other aetiology
  - Fever( $\geq 38^{\circ}$ C);
  - Pneumonia or Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS), based on radiological evidence;
  - -Low or normal WBC count, or reduced in lymphocyte differential count in early
  - No obvious improvement after antibiotic treatment for 3~5 days
- 7. A "cluster" is defined as two or more persons with SARI, with onset of symptoms within the same two-week period and who are associated with a specific setting, such as a classroom, workplace, household, same ward in hospital, or same region in residential institution, etc.
