HIV/AIDS SITUATION IN MACAO Quarterly HIV/AIDS Statistics (Jan. – Mar., 2010)

In the first quarter of 2010, were reported 6 cases of HIV infections, being males and females half and half. Of the newly HIV cases reported in this quarter, 2 were local residents (1 of which was an intravenous drug user and in 1 case the way of transmission was indeterminate due to insufficient information). The other 4 cases were detected in non-resident individuals, being all of them acquired the infection through heterosexual contact, and among them 1 was found working in the entertainment industry. (table 1)

Cumulatively, since 1986 up to the end of March, 2010, a total of 433 HIV infections were reported in Macao, being 50% diagnosed in temporary residents working in the entertainment industry; 44 of HIV infected patients have progressed to AIDS. The major route of transmission has been sexual, which constituted 67.4%, corresponding 59.1% to the heterosexual transmission and 8.1% to the homosexual transmission. The injecting drug use represented 13.6% of the infections. (table 1)
